



Mission Minutes



Muslims and the Virus

From Rev. Dan McNerney with Frontier Fellowship:

In Egypt, the total number of coronavirus cases remains relatively low compared to the rest of the world. However, the need for social distancing has devastated the lives of millions of day laborers who struggle to find work, causing great economic hardships. As a result, the Presbyterian Church of Egypt has helped deliver boxes of food to the most destitute people in their local neighborhoods, whether Christian or Muslim, often keeping people from starving. Presbyterian pastors and seminary students have traveled throughout Cairo with cleaning equipment, disinfecting both churches and mosques. The Muslims of Cairo have been greatly touched and moved by these unexpected acts of kindness from their Christian neighbors.

Because of the pandemic, economies are crashing, not only in Iran, but also in Iraq and the other oil-producing countries of the Arabian Peninsula. Worldwide demand for crude oil has dropped dramatically. As a result of this phenomenon and other contributing factors, Saudi Arabia has begun to relax many of its strict religious laws to appease the concerns of potential investors from Western countries. The Saudi Arabian government is in growing need of foreign investment. Slowly, greater religious freedom is entering into its country and throughout the Arabian Peninsula, creating a much more favorable environment for a growing number of Muslims to explore and potentially embrace the truth claims of Jesus Christ.

CPC, through our mission funding, supports some of the covert evangelism in Egypt and surrounding countries. Thank you all for your gifts to CPC.

Trustees' Report



Building

- The sump pump that malfunctioned was diagnosed and needs several parts to repair. Our vendor could not get the parts from the manufacturer, as they are operating at a reduced capacity due to the pandemic. The vendor was able to source the parts through some 3rd party sources and should have the pump repaired and reinstalled in the next few weeks. The temporary pump that they installed in the interim is a rental unit, but after discussion with the sales group they agreed to cap the rental cost for the length of the period it should have taken to repair and reinstall our pump. This will save us several weeks of rental fees.

- Service Express completed our spring preventative maintenance check on all the Air Conditioning units in the church. All units were tested, filters replaced, and everything is running properly for the summer season. This is good news :<)

Manse

At the end of May, the windows A/C unit in one of the manse bedrooms quit working. After researching some replacement options and discussion with the Schwarz family, we replaced it with a higher capacity portable unit that was installed within a couple of days.

Dear Church family and friends,

We hope and pray this message finds you safe and well. During the COVID-19 pandemic, the Session, Deacons, and Trustees continue to re-imagine their roles in reaching out to fellow members, to the community and to care for each other.

We thank Reverends Lolly and Bunny for their leadership during this time. While we are sad that underlying health concerns have led them to decide that they cannot lead us as we gradually reopen the building, we are so thankful for their spiritual guidance over the last seven months. They have led us to the virtual world and done a wonderful job of helping us to stay connected with our congregation. Having said this, we recognize the extraordinary benefits of our virtual services and contact with our congregational family. We have jumped into the virtual world and have NO plans to stop this venue of outreach. It is a part of our future that we hope to continue to embrace.

Even though the building is temporarily shuttered, we are so encouraged that our Church continues to actively worship together and connect with our Community of faith family. Virtual Sunday services, Bible Study groups, coffee time, and youth gatherings are being held. At each step, we will be evaluating resources, safety, and essential services. In planning for in-person worship services, more social interaction with our congregation, and opening the Growing Place, we are committed to compliance with restrictions set by State of Illinois and DCFS (for The Growing Place). The safety of our membership, employees, and larger community are of utmost concern to us.

We continue to brainstorm, invite comments, suggestions, and participation of any who wish to step forward in planning, researching, procuring resources, and implementing the next phases. We welcome and need your help! If you can come alongside us in service to our cherished Church family, please contact Carol Brunton, Clerk of Session at 630-620-4571.

The Session and Personnel will be meeting with the Presbytery Committee on Ministry. We will start a search for a new interim minister soon.

The Peace Which Lasts

Philippians 4:6-7 (NKJV) Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication, with thanksgiving, let your requests be made known to God; and the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus.

Repeat the above words each morning when you start the day, and each evening when you retire. They will change your life. Note the progression. We are to rejoice! Why? The Lord is at hand. That's the reason we can be free from worry. Each problem, challenge, or opportunity should be surrendered to the Lord in prayer, asking for His guidance and power. Then the peace of God comes flooding into our minds and hearts.

Paul tells us that it is a peace which surpasses understanding. This does not mean that it cannot be experienced, but that the total breadth and depth of it is beyond human comprehension. We cannot produce the peace of God. It is impossible to capture it. Nor can we earn or deserve it. Peace is a gift of God. It cost Him Calvary and is synonymous with His indwelling Spirit. Peace is the Spirit of God in Christ reproducing His character in us. Jesus Christ, God with us, exemplified peace. He was in complete harmony with God. His oneness with the Father was the source of the indefatigable peace we see and feel in the Gospels. There was no panic, no rushing, no worried frenzy.

Christ went to the cross to settle the problem which robs us of peace. He suffered to forgive us and reconcile us. How could His death be a cosmic atonement for all time? That's what surpasses our understanding. Only when we recognize that "God was in Christ reconciling the world to Himself" do we begin to understand. When we accept His love through the cross, we begin to experience the immense peace which is offered to us. It takes a lifetime to plumb its depth. The peace of God gives us peace with God and then pervades our minds and emotions until our total life is oriented around Him and we are made like Jesus.

Thought: *Peace which cannot be contrived or totally comprehended is a gift. I can be at peace when all the world around me is in turmoil.*
